

# Collapsing States, Shifting Memories: Understanding Ukraine's War and Displacement

Russia's war against Ukraine did not begin in 2022. Nor did its impact stop at the frontlines. Two new publications of former URIS fellows offer essential perspectives—one on the war's origins, the other on its lasting effects on identity and memory.

Seize the City, Undo the State - Serhiy Kudelia examines how the Ukrainian state unraveled in Donbas in 2014. Through over 100 first-hand interviews, he reveals how local actors, Russian influence, and historical tensions shaped the early phase of the war—offering a rare, granular view of state collapse.
